recently, the new **DFE White Paper** covered many things, but two key comments guided us towards the new CPD available for school leaders.

"Schools will be able to have a trained literacy expert through a **new**National Professional Qualification for Leading Literacy", the White paper stated, plus it was made explicit that "we will make sure every child starts schools with a firm foundation of literacy and numeracy through a new National Professional Qualification for Early Years

Leaders, and up to £180m investment in the early years' workforce, including literacy and numeracy training for early years practitioners."

So it is timely that Ambition Institute, our NPQ Lead Provider, has been issued with the contract to provide these new qualifications. We will be commencing them in October 2022 – more info below.

ECT Information session -14^{th} June 2022 (3.30 - 5.00). This virtual session will be suitable for school leaders and induction co-ordinators who have ECTs in their school in the coming year. You will hear about the ECT support and the role of the mentor in your school. You will gain clarity on the registration process, the link to the Appropriate Body, the ECF programme structure and commitments for your mentor and ECT. We will be joined by a current Induction Tutor, a Mentor and a colleague from the Appropriate Body so that all your queries can be covered.

NPQ Information session -16^{th} June 2022 (3.30 - 5.00). This virtual session will be suitable for school CPD leads who are considering which programmes will suit staff for the coming year. You will hear about all of the NPQs, both the Specialist programmes (lasting 12 months) and the Leadership programmes (which last 18 months). You will gain clarity on programme structure, dates, commitments and benefits. We will be joined by a current facilitator and participant so that you can hear from their perspective too.

For Autumn - New NPQs for Early Years and Leading Literacy

From Autumn 2022 two further fully-funded NPQs will be available:

National Professional Qualification for Leading Literacy (NPQLL) – for teachers who have, or are aspiring to have, responsibilities for leading literacy across a school, year group, key stage or phase.

Literacy leaders need to have a deep understanding of the fundamental importance of literacy and recognise the influence it has on pupils' future academic achievement, wellbeing and success in life. An excellent literacy leader will have expertise across a number of specialist areas related to their role and a passion for literature that they want to share with the school community. This qualification will therefore have a significant focus on Developing Language; Developing Reading and Developing Writing.

National Professional Qualification for Early Years Leadership (NPQEYL) – for leaders qualified to at least Level 3 with a full and relevant qualification who are, or are aspiring to be, managers of Private, Voluntary and Independent nurseries, headteachers of school-based and maintained nurseries, or childminders with leadership responsibilities.

A child's experiences between birth and age five have a major impact on their future life chances. Leading a nursery requires a wealth of strategic and operational knowledge and the role is reliant on working with and through colleagues. A priority of this qualification is to help early years leaders to continuously develop their knowledge and skills throughout their careers so every child gets the best start in life.

NASENCO

The National Award for SEN Co-ordination is a mandatory requirement for all SENCOs new to the role in mainstream schools and academies and is viewed as excellent career development for aspirant SENCOs. In the Autumn term Manor Primary Academy will be hosting a new cohort.

Final important advice for Schools with new Early Career Teachers in September.

During May every school will receive an email from the DFE about registering Early Career Teachers who start in September. As a school you will need to do 3 things. Firstly go to https://manage-training-for-early-career-teachers.education.gov.uk/ and register your Induction Tutor and the new ECT (with name, TRN and DoB). Secondly, let us know if you would like the Teaching School Hub to provide the ECF training for them and their mentor. Finally you also need to engage an Appropriate Body to provide the statutory induction services.
