

New Early Career Teachers? What to do next

If you know that you have new ECTs for next year it is now possible to register them for both the **Appropriate Body (AB) services** (for statutory Induction) and also for the **ECF CPD entitlement**. As your local provider of both of these services, Manor Teaching School Hub is a natural partner.



To provide this CPD entitlement to your ECTs we work with Ambition Institute, whose exceptional programme is structured as below. We hope that you will join with hundreds of other local ECTs to work with us giving teachers the powerful start to their career that they deserve.



So your next step is for your school Induction Co-ordinator to register ECTs and Mentors with the DfE, https://manage-training-for-early-career-teachers.education.gov.uk/how-to-set-up-your-programme provides a step by step guide. You will need to select Ambition Institute as your provider and let us know that you want Manor Teaching School Hub to provide either, or both of your, Appropriate Body and/or ECF training provision. Computing Hub CPD

Are you new/aspiring to teach secondary Computing at KS3 and GCSE level, looking to teach Computing as a second subject, or want to enhance your subject knowledge? Courses are free with generous bursaries available up to a maximum of £1,800 per participant. These bursaries have to be used by July 2022 – don't miss out!

Primary Computing Courses

A wide range of courses available in the Summer Term, including:

Leading Primary Computing - remote (2 days): 22nd June, 9.00 – 15.00 *and* 29th June 9.30 - 14.15 Leading primary computing - 22 June

Outstanding Primary Computing for all: 12th July, 9.30 – 15.30, face-to-face/Birmingham location Outstanding primary computing for all

Courses cost £65 per day, with a bursary to schools of £220 per day.

Science CPD Opportunity

Thinking, Doing, Talking Science (TDTS) is a four-and-a-half day primary teacher training programme developed by Science Oxford and Oxford Brookes University, which has been shown to significantly improve pupils' attainment in science and their attitudes towards science, as well as increasing teachers' confidence in the subject and their enjoyment of teaching it.

Year 5 pupils in schools using the TDTS approach made approximately three additional months' progress in science. The programme had a particularly positive effect on girls and on pupils with lower prior attainment and on pupils eligible for free school meals.

Throughout the four-and-a-half day training programme, strategies are exemplified through Year 5 curriculum content and focus on creative and challenging science lessons that enable pupils to use higher order thinking skills. A wide range of easily implementable strategies (supported by comprehensive resources) will be shared, such as ways to encourage pupils to talk about scientific concepts through dedicated discussion times, problem solving and investigation activities and ideas to focus pupils' recording so that there is always time for practical science.


This project is jointly funded by the EEF and Wellcome Trust as part of the Improving Science Education grant partnership. They are currently seeking schools to take part in the main Randomised Control Trial starting in September 2022. 

English Hub Update

The English Hub is based at St John Bosco Primary in West Bromwich and the prime aim is to make improvements in schools in early reading. All support is FREE. There are 4 tiers of support:

Tier 1- Showcase Schools are invited to attend an online Showcase, where you will have to opportunity to observe






Tier 3 - Medium Level Support The English Hub will deliver CPD sessions for the needs identified from the Audit for all teaching staff to attend.

Tier 4 - Partner School If your school is chosen to be a Partner school, your school will receive 9 days' support from a Literacy Specialist, 6 days' support starting the next academic year and a further 3 days the following academic year.



Registration OPEN for New NPQs

The **registration** is **NOW OPEN** for the NPQs for Autumn 2022. The wonderful news is that all programmes will now receive full funding for state schools.



Firstly decide which NPQ is right for you. Our website https://manorteachingschoolhub.com/npq/ has all of the information that you need to make this decision. Then let us know you wish to register by using this QR code.

Ambition Institute will then get in touch to enable you to register with the DfE for your funding. You will need your teacher reference number (TRN) and to use your school email address. Following your DFE registration Ambition will on-board you to the programme.



National Leaders of Education recruitment

- requires improvement (RI) to outstanding or from inadequate to good/outstanding;
