Fully Funded - All teachers and leaders employed in state funded schools in England can access the National Professional Qualifications at no cost.

## Maths Hubs – cross phase CPD opportunities

The EEF Report 'Improving Mathematics in Key Stages 2 & 3' suggested eight recommendations, supported by research findings, focusing on the questions that appear to be most salient to practitioners regarding the teaching of KS2 and KS3 mathematics. Recommendations focus on findings that schools can use to make a significant difference to pupils' learning. The Shaw Maths Hub (covering Wolverhampton) and Maths Hub North Midlands (covering Walsall and South Staffs) are running <a href="Years 5-8 Continuity Work Groups">Years 5-8 Continuity Work Groups</a> suitable for both primary and secondary colleagues.

In Walsall and South Staffs the Y5-8
Continuity Work Group aims to strengthen the transition from primary to secondary school by focusing on curriculum and pedagogical continuity. Maths Hub North Midlands will be running two groups including one specifically for middle schools. Click to book here.

The Wolverhampton based Y5-8 Continuity Work Group will draw on cross-phase knowledge to support children's continuity in learning. Materials which stimulate reasoning and oracy, including EAL developments, will be shared to use with classes. Book here for free sessions for Wolverhampton practitioners.

Primary Subject Leadership - will consider the key skills, knowledge and behaviours required by primary subject leaders to effectively lead and embed school-wide developments in mathematics. Plus a raft of other Work Group opportunities inc Early Years, Primary and Post-16.

## **Initial Teacher Training good news!**

The West Midlands has excellent provision for Teacher training and over recent months many of our amazing providers have been reaccredited by the DFE to train the future generations of teachers.

Our congratulations to these providers!

We all know that recruiting teachers into the profession is a challenge so I wanted to alert you to recent incentives announced by the DFE:

- Scholarships worth £29,000 tax-free offered in partnership with professional bodies for chemistry, computing, mathematics, and physics.
- Languages scholarship worth £27,000 tax-free available in French, German and Spanish.
- £25,000 tax-free bursary for geography and languages (including ancient languages).
- £20,000 tax-free bursary for biology and design & technology.
- £15,000 tax-free bursary for English.
- Extended bursary/scholarship eligibility to non-UK trainees in languages and physics.


## **SENCo Development**
