If you have ECTs leaving your school this summer - notify your Appropriate Body that an ECT is leaving your school, complete their assessment and mark them as a leaver and ensure the ECT has a record of their reports to take with them to the next school.

Update DFE records regarding this ECT and the mentor on the [DFE Manage Training for Early Career Teacher site](#). This will feed through to notifying the ECF provider automatically.

What will your new ECTs study over the two years?

Early Career Teacher - Year 1

Carefully sequenced curriculum to fit day-to-day teaching. Designed with national experts underpinned by the research on how children learn. Strands focused on:

1. **Behaviour** – consistent routines, creating a positive learning environment, overcoming low-level disruption and creating high expectations in the classroom.
2. **Instruction** - questioning, scaffolding and modelling, the importance that prior knowledge plays in learning, meeting the needs of all pupils and using feedback effectively.
3. **Subject** - Creating good planning habits to support learning goals, examining and addressing the gaps and misconceptions pupils may have and how literacy can be developed across all subjects.

ECTs learn through:

- Face to face conferences
- Virtual workshops (known as clinics)
- Regular modules of online learning and reflection on Steplab
- Regular instructional coaching sessions with their mentor who will provide specific, bite-sized steps to practice each week

Early Career Teacher - Year 2

1. **Self-directed study to develop year 1 learning**
2. **Continued mentor support through fortnightly, one-to-one instructional coaching with their mentor – with opportunities to observe others' practice during this time**
3. **Learning to be self-reflective and self driven to continue to learn and improve**
4. **Additional research and resources to stretch and challenge ECTs**
5. **Continued development through conferences and clinics**

NEW CPD - Improving Writing in your Primary school

Improving Writing is in many Primary improvement plans and starting in Autumn 2023 we have a three-twilight programme to support your school.

You will reflect on the principles and strategies adopted in your own setting and identify how to develop existing curriculum to ensure a clear progression of knowledge and skills from early writing opportunities in reception through to the end of KS2.

Workshops will explore:

- long term curriculum goals
- progression of skills
- year group provisions
- the journey through the writing process
- effective scaffolding
- the effective introduction of new or revised strategies with the teaching staff

There will be two alternative sessions, designed and delivered by Simon Mosley, who recently worked as an HMI and was regional lead for SEND:

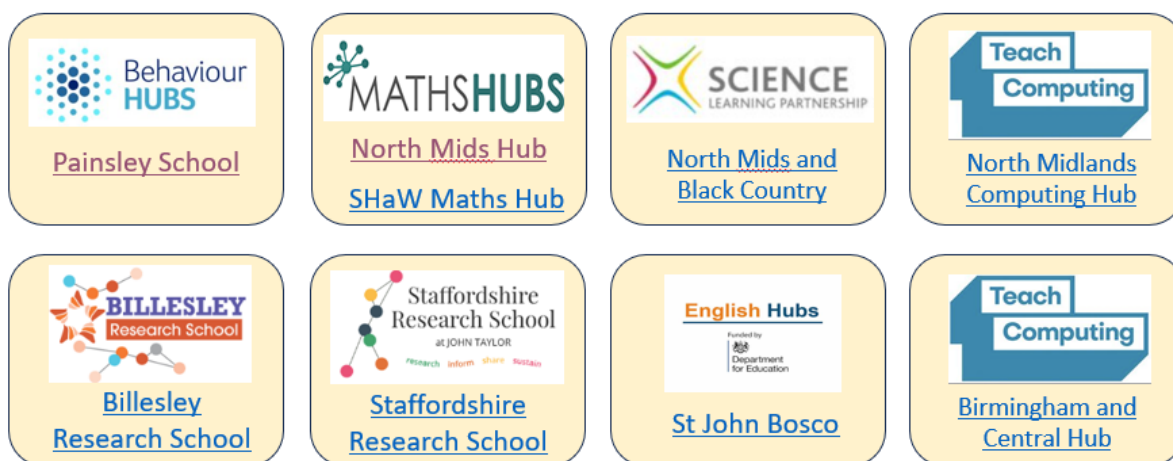
- **Autumn programme delivered in one full day** – Tuesday 5th December 2023 (9.30am to 3.30pm) hosted at Manor Teaching School Hub
